Exceptional surgical process Advancing Public Health

We are glad to share another significant achievement at JBM GMC.

A 4-year-old girl presented with an abdominal lump. Following detailed clinical examination and investigations, she was diagnosed with a left-sided Wilms' tumor (nephroblastoma), a rare kidney tumor commonly seen in children.

The child underwent successful surgery . A left radical nephrectomy, along with resection of a small portion of the diaphragm involved with the tumor, was performed successfully. She was successfully extubated post-operatively and is currently stable in the Paediatric ICU under close monitoring.

We sincerely thank Dr. Tushar Patil and his surgical team for their excellent work in successfully performing this challenging procedure. We also express our gratitude to Dr. Subedar, Dr. Yogesh Borse, and their team for providing outstanding anaesthesia care in this difficult paediatric case.

We also thank JR Dr.Savita Choudhary who diagnosed the case on USG for the first time which was corroborated and confirmed on FNAC. In the era of radiologists writing 'correlate clinically' Dr. Savita along with her colleagues in the department showed exceptional conviction in diagnosing it on ultrasound itself.

A special thanks to all the nursing staff and OT personnel whose dedication and teamwork contributed immensely to the successful outcome.

With the guidance and support of Dean Dr. Rathod sir, we continue to enhance our capabilities and expand the scope of advanced surgical care in remote and tribal regions such as Nandurbar.

Advancing public health

A 48-year-old female patient with a giant Gastrointestinal Stromal Tumor (GIST), measuring approximately 14 × 15 cm, arising from the mesentery of the descending colon, underwent successful surgical management. The tumor was located anterior to the left kidney and was densely adherent to the inferior vena cava (IVC) and aorta, making the procedure technically demanding. Despite these challenges, complete excision of the tumor was successfully achieved.

A Gastrointestinal Stromal Tumor (GIST) is a rare type of sarcoma (soft tissue cancer) that originates in the gastrointestinal tract. These tumors arise from specialized nerve cells called the interstitial cells of Cajal (ICCs), which act as the "pacemakers" of the digestive system by signaling the gut muscles to contract.

While they most frequently occur in the stomach or small intestine, finding a GIST of this magnitude arising from the mesentery (the fold of tissue that anchors the intestines to the back of the abdominal wall) is both rare and surgically complex.

If not surgically treated it can cause fatal complications such as internal hemorrhage, organ compression leading to kidney failure or bowel obstruction, Tumour rupture or even metastasise to liver or peritoneum.

This complex surgery was performed under the leadership of Dr. Tushar Patil, with the valuable support of Dr. Nilesh Mangam, Dr. Shailesh Patil, and the entire surgical team. The anesthesia was led by Dr. Subhedar and the anesthesia team, whose expertise and dedication were instrumental in the successful conduct of this prolonged and challenging procedure.

Special thanks to Priyanka Sister, Sushma Sister, and all the Operation Theatre staff for their unwavering support and dedication.

We also express our sincere gratitude to Dean Dr. Rathod Sir for his constant guidance, encouragement, and support throughout.

It is a matter of great pride to record that this complex surgical intervention marks a historic medical milestone. This is the first time a procedure of this magnitude and technical difficulty has been successfully performed within a government healthcare setup in Nandurbar District. This achievement reflects the growing capabilities and commitment of our public health infrastructure to deliver advanced, life-saving tertiary care to the community.
