Maharashtra Government Abolishes One-Year MBBS Bond Service

In a landmark decision, the Government of Maharashtra has abolished the mandatory one-year Social Responsibility (Bond) Service for MBBS graduates. The decision, announced through a Government Resolution issued on 23 July 2026, brings major relief to thousands of medical students across the state.

Previously, MBBS graduates from government, municipal, aided, and eligible private medical colleges were required to complete one year of compulsory service in government healthcare facilities before pursuing further career opportunities. However, due to the increasing number of graduates and the limited availability of bond service postings, many students experienced delays in postgraduate admissions and career progression.

Under the new policy, candidates who have not yet joined their allotted bond service or are awaiting postings are exempt from the compulsory service requirement. However, doctors who have already joined their bond postings will continue to complete their remaining tenure. The government has also clarified that no fresh bond service allotments will be made under the abolished MBBS bond scheme.

The decision has been widely welcomed by medical students and the healthcare community, as it is expected to streamline postgraduate admissions, reduce administrative delays, and provide greater flexibility for young doctors in planning their careers.
